

**Graham P. Bailey,

After I graduated, I took up a position as a trainee Reproduction Toxicologist with a U.K. contract research laboratory. Since that time, I have worked in the pre-clinical arena in a variety of contract research facilities within Europe.

I became a member of the European Teratology Society in 1982 and joined the American Teratology Society in 1997.

After holding the position of Head of Reproduction Toxicology at Sequani Ltd, a contract research laboratory based in Herefordshire England, for 9 years I joined Johnson & Johnson in Beerse Belgium in early 2003 as Senior Scientific Director and Fellow, Reproduction and Juvenile Toxicology. In this role I was responsible for the conduct and evaluation of studies conducted within Pharmaceutical Research and Development. An integral part of this role was developing and customising testing rationales and study designs to suit specific test article or regulatory requirements. In addition, I had a role providing advice on testing strategies, regulatory interaction, problem solving and mitigation.

In 2007, 2009 I jointly organised and lectured in the Paediatric Toxicology module as part of the M.Sc. Modular Training Programme in Applied Toxicology at the University of Surrey.

Since 2006 I have jointly organised the J&J Juvenile Toxicology Symposium in Belgium including the most recent (8th meeting in May 2019 with 120 participants from 40 different companies.

I retired from J&J in December 2020 after 40 years working as a Reproductive Toxicologist during that the whole of that period, in addition to other duties, I continued to be a 'hands on' Study Director.
